

The funds are requested for 1.) improving the existing carriage path that extends roughly 0.5 miles from Hayden Rowe towards Joseph Road with a stone dust surface to make it more usable by the public, resulting in a multi-use surface similar to that currently on the Center Trail 2.) marking the parking lot on Hayden Rowe to encourage public access to and use of the 5 parcels that have already been paid for by the taxpayers of Hopkinton, together with appropriate signage. 3.) Developing a simple dog park, with appropriate fencing around an approximately 1 acre field portion of the Hughes property. This area would allow owners to allow their dogs to run off-lease in a controlled area and would also allow ready access to a woods trail for dog walking. Some engineering will be necessary to upgrade the trail for the crossings of two open stream beds on the existing carriage path, and for improvements to the two existing bridges. The first existing bridge over the headwaters of the Charles River is made of granite slabs, and is very strong but may need improvements to make for a smoother crossing. The western bridge currently is made of old railroad ties, and will need to be replaced. Depending on results from public outreach, this path may eventually become part of the Upper Charles Rail Trail connecting between Milford and the Center Trail. The CPC money will be supplemented with a substantial amount of volunteer labor, as was done to develop the Center Trail.

As with previous sections of the Upper Charles Trail, this trail will enable people in Hopkinton to get exercise and enjoy the outdoors in an environment free of traffic. The path will be kept clear of high weeds and encroaching branches to facilitate access. When this new segment of the trail is extended to the Center Trail, by a route as yet undetermined, the most densely populated parts of Hopkinton will have access to the trail. The respite center on Main Street, and two group homes on Hayden Rowe will be able to take advantage of the rail trail system. It may take additional years to complete the whole rail trail system from Hopkinton State Park and Legacy Farms to the Milford rail trail. The addition of this project will be key part of this link. To accomplish this, CPC funds will provide a key role.

The Request for this project of \$50,000 will enable us to get the trail, parking area and dog area developed. A DCR grant for 80% reimbursement will be applied for as well. This 2nd grant requires 20% matching funds from town money, which this CPC outlay will satisfy.

Finally, plans are underway to formalize a 501c3 fund for Friends of the Hopkinton Rail Trail, perhaps in association with the 26.2 foundation. Experience with the Center Trail indicates that volunteers with construction experience will significantly reduce construction expenses.

C. PROJECT BENEFITS

- 9. How many persons will benefit from the project? The Center Trail gets regular use mostly by residents who live close to the trail but also by residents who drive to the trail. We would expect a similar use pattern for the Hughes trail, with the additional benefit to dog owners of a place to walk their dogs and let their dogs play off-leash. We would expect several hundred users prior to developing the bike path, with many more once people become familiar with the trail and it becomes connected with other trails. The Friends of the Milford Upper Charles Trail conducted a census of usage of their trail on May 18th, 2013, in which 1921 people were counted on the trail (see http://milfordtrail.org/pdf/2013trailcensus.pdf). While Hopkinton is less densely populated than Milford, we expect trail use to still be substantial.
- 10. How many of those benefiting are estimated to be of low or moderate income and what is the source of this estimate? The people likely to benefit at first will mostly be those that live nearby. It is estimated that approximately 10% of users will be of low or moderate income. This reflects the approximate overall percentage of Massachusetts residents with incomes up to 149% of the poverty level. It is anticipated that the usage of the trail will be representative of the general population. In addition, depending on the route, the Upper Charles Trail may pass near enough to affordable housing locations in Hopkinton to attract more usage, such as from the Affordable Housing that is being developed off Lumber Street, after that is connected to the Center Trail.
- 11. How many of those benefiting are estimated to be minorities and which minority groups will be assisted?

We have no data regarding where minorities live, but the rail trail will benefit everyone who lives close to it, or who can park near it. According to the National Citizen Survey, Hopkinton is ~95% Caucasian.

Other rail trails in operation (like the existing bike trail in Milford, and the Minuteman trail in Arlington) have collected and published the numbers of people that use the bike trail. We plan on using similar means.

The best evidence for support is in the surveys recently gathered during the Hopkinton Visioning meeting recently held at the senior center (10-28-2014). One of the most uniformly positive results of all had to do with the desirability of extending bike trails to Milford. Moreover, previous surveys collected by the Land Use and Planning Department, posted at the Hopkinton town web site, support this conclusion. For example, in 2013 the town completed the National Citizen Survey conducted by the National Research Center, which deals with positive and negative aspects of living in Hopkinton. This was posted on October 3rd, 2013. Hopkinton rated 226th out 263 communities with regard to ease of bicycle use, 218th out of 256 with regard to ease of walking, among the poorest ratings of all categories. A bike trail will be of particular value to families with small children, who will be safer away from traffic.



The funds are requested for buying parcel U12 23 0. The eastern edge of this parcel is important to access the old rail bed that extends east toward legacy farms, and the land currently owned by the Town of Hopkinton



east of the Center School. Formal access to this Hopkinton owned land from east Main Street will eventually require negotiations with private landowners. However, these landowners have traditionally allowed public access on existing old carriage roads across their property, and we expect that any future negotiations with them will not hinder them from developing their private land as they choose. The reason why we are making this request now for parcel U12 23 0 is that this parcel is currently on the market by the owners, and if we do not buy it now, we will lose an important connection for the entire Upper Charles Trail System. We are requesting only \$30000 even though it is currently assessed for \$148300 because we do not believe the property is buildable due to extensive wetlands along the frontage with Main Street. Once this property is bought, little work will be required for some public use other than whacking weeds, as this edge of the property has traditionally been used by trail-goers, as is evident by the equestrian crossing sign on East Main Street. After the land is acquired, the expertise of Peter LaGoy in developing the Center Trail will be applied to these trails, and we plan to supplement the CPC money for buying this parcel with a substantial amount of volunteer labor, as was done to develop the Center Trail.

As with previous sections of the Upper Charles Trail, this trail will enable people in Hopkinton to get exercise and enjoy the outdoors in an environment free of traffic. The path will be kept clear of high weeds and encroaching branches to facilitate access. Together with appropriate easements with private landowners across parcels U12 25 0, U12 22 0 and parcel U12 10 0, acquisition of this parcel will facilitate access between Legacy Farms South, the athletic fields north of Main Street, the Elmwood property already owned by the Town of Hopkinton on Ash Street (parcel U20 30 1 by way of Town of Hopkinton parcels R19 69 0 and U17 28A), and the Center School / Town Common area. There is currently a walkable path starting from the eastern edge of parcel U17 52A to the Elmwood School area, that has been developed as an Eagle Scout project by Jordan Hanna (Troop 4A). A 2nd eagle scout, Ryan Dunn, is in the early stages of designing a better trail to link between the Center School and the path made by Jordan Hanna and to the existing carriage roads that extend out to parcel U12 23 O that we would like the town to buy.

Additional funds to develop the rail trail may eventually be available to Hopkinton from the Environmental Bond Bill that may release \$1.5 million dollars to help with the rail trail. Some money for the northern part of the rail trail may become available from the \$5 million MassWorks Infrastructure Program grant that was awarded to Legacy farms and the Town of Hopkinton in October of 2014 to focus on roadways, streetscapes and water and sewer projects that support housing and economic growth. Finally, plans are underway to formalize a 501c3 fund for Friends of the Hopkinton Rail Trail, perhaps in association with the 26.2 foundation. Experience with the Center Trail indicates that volunteers with construction experience will significantly reduce construction expenses.

It is estimated that approximately 10% of users will be of low or moderate income. This reflects the approximate overall percentage of Massachusetts residents with incomes up to 149% of the poverty level. It is anticipated that the usage of the trail will be representative of the general population. In addition, depending on the route, the Upper Charles Trail may pass near enough to affordable housing locations

in Hopkinton to attract more usage, such as from any Affordable Housing units in the Legacy Farms area.

We have no data regarding where minorities live, but the rail trail will benefit everyone who lives close to it, or who can park near it. According to the National Citizen Survey, Hopkinton is ~95% Caucasian.

Other rail trails in operation (like the existing bike trail in Milford, and the Minuteman trail in Arlington) have collected and published the numbers of people that use the bike trail. We plan on using similar means.






